
Key Words- Strophic song form

Bridge	A section in a song that links two other sections.
Instrumental	A section in the music with no lyrics and the instruments contain the melodic interest.
Outro	The ending section of a song.








Key Words- Guitar effects

Low fi	The quality of the sound. A deliberate choice to add imperfections in the sound quality.
Fuzz	Describing the timbre or sound of an electric guitar
Stripped Back	Not many instruments. Thin texture to the music
