Sparx Maths

Sparx

The maths dept are pleased to introduce Sparx Maths, a personalised and intelligent platform that is proven to boost grades. It is used in 23 countries by over 2,000 schools, 40,000 teachers and 1.8 million students.

All pupils in Key Stage 3 and Key Stage 4 will now complete their weekly online homework via the Sparx Mathematics app.

The login details are the pupil's school email and their school password; the details they use to login to the school computers.

Pupils must complete all modules and achieve 100%. We can check how long pupils have spent on it and how many questions they have attempted. There are videos to watch if they are unsure on a particular topic.

The homework will go live and at 15:00 on the following days: Y7 (Monday), Y8 (Tuesday), Y9 (Wednesday), Y10 (Thursday) and Y11 (Friday). The deadline will be exactly seven days later.



Days off cost good grades!



The DfE published research showing that pupils attending school with 95%+ attendance are more than twice as likely to achieve 5 GCSEs at grade 5+ than those with 90% attendance.

What can families do?

- Be firm. Send your child to school every day, all day, unless they are severely ill;
- Schedule appointments and extracurricular activities outside of school time;
- ☑ Avoid taking holidays during term-time;
- ☑ Encourage your child to have good sleep, morning and punctuality routines;
- Seek help from us before your concerns become serious. We are always here to support.

Each day missed...

- Puts your child behind and makes it more difficult to catch up;
- Can lead to gaps in learning and lost connections with friends;
- Makes the transition into the workforce or further education less likely to be successful.
